PUBLIC HEALTH RESEARCH WITHIN THE CONTEXT OF THE SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH NOW DRAWS A GREATER CORRELATION BETWEEN ECONOMIC CONDITIONS AND CONDITIONS OF HEALTH AND WELL-BEING. WITH SUPPORT FROM DENVER PUBLIC HEALTH, WE WERE ABLE TO LEVERAGE A GIS MAPPING AND ANALYTICS TOOL TO GAIN NEIGHBORHOOD SPECIFIC DATA ABOUT POVERTY, EDUCATION, LANGUAGE AND UNINSURED/UNDERINSURANCE LEVELS.

ECONOMIC STABILITY WAS IDENTIFIED BY THE COMMUNITY TASK FORCE AS A MAJOR LEVER RELATED TO MANY SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH. IN 2019, SAINT JOSEPH

HOSPITAL (SJH) INITIATED A NUMBER OF EFFORTS IN THE SURROUNDING NEIGHBORHOODS WHICH DIRECT HOSPITAL RESOURCES TO INFLUENCE ECONOMIC STABILITY.

1. LOCAL PROCUREMENT HAS BEEN SHOWN TO IMPACT COMMUNITY WEALTH AND WELLBEING. IN 2019 SJH BEGAN REDIRECTING A PORTION OF EXTERNAL CATERING NEEDS TOWARDS HYPER-LOCAL, COMMUNITY OWNED, AND START-UP BUSINESSES. THE PILOT PERIOD BEGAN WITH ONE LARGE DEPARTMENT USING LOCAL RESOURCES AND IT HAS SINCE SPREAD TO BE AN INITIATIVE EMBRACED BY OTHER DEPARTMENTS ACROSS THE HOSPITAL. IN 2020 SJH WAS ABLE TO DOCUMENT MORE THAN \$30,000 SPENT WITH NEIGHBORHOOD CATERING BUSINESSES THAT WOULD HAVE OTHERWISE BEEN DIRECTED TO NATIONAL CHAINS. THE EFFECT OF THIS SMALL PIVOT IN HOW SJH DOES BUSINESS MEANS THAT THE DOLLARS SPENT LOCALLY CIRCULATE IN THE LOCAL ECONOMY FIVE TIMES MORE THAN THEY WOULD HAVE UNDER THE PREVIOUS APPROACH. IN 2021 EFFORTS ARE UNDERWAY TO INFORM OUR COMMUNITY PARTNERS OF THIS APPROACH AND LOCAL CATERING LISTS HAVE ALREADY BEEN DISTRIBUTED TO FIVE LARGE ORGANIZATIONS WHO ARE BEGINNING TO USE HYPER-LOCAL CATERING TO SUPPLEMENT VARIOUS CATERING NEEDS.

2. IN AN EFFORT TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE FUTURE SUCCESS OF NEIGHBORHOOD YOUTH, THE ASSOCIATES OF SJH MENTORED STUDENTS FROM MANUAL HIGH SCHOOL FOR THE 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR. MANUAL IS LOCATED SEVERAL BLOCKS NORTH OF SAINT JOSEPH HOSPITAL IN THE FIVE POINTS NEIGHBORHOOD, AN AREA NEGATIVELY IMPACTED BY RAPID GENTRIFICATION. STUDENTS INTERESTED IN PURSUING A CAREER IN HEALTH CARE ARE MATCHED WITH CLINICAL AND NON-CLINICAL ASSOCIATES WHO SPEND THREE TO FIVE HOURS EACH MONTH INTERACTING IN A FACILITATED ENVIRONMENT. STUDENTS AND MENTORS FOLLOW A STRUCTURED SET OF

ACTIVITIES TO HELP EACH STUDENT ENVISION POTENTIAL EDUCATIONAL AND PROFESSIONAL PATHS. AT THE END OF THE SCHOOL YEAR. 96% OF STUDENTS REPORTED A STRONGER LEVEL OF CONFIDENCE TO PURSUE A CAREER IN A STEAM (SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, ARTS, AND MATHEMATICS) FIELD. WHILE THE ACTIVITIES WERE CARRIED OUT VIRTUALLY THIS YEAR, THE IMPACT HAS BEEN SIMILAR TO PREVIOUS YEARS. MANUAL HIGH SCHOOL REQUESTED THAT THE 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR HAVE AN INTENTIONAL FOCUS ON PAIRING STUDENT OF COLOR WITH MENTORS OF COLOR. THE MENTOR COHORT INCLUDED PRIMARILY ASSOCIATES OF COLOR FROM THE AREAS OF MEDICINE, LAW, NURSING, GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION AND PROCUREMENT.

3. HOUSING PRICES CONTINUE TO OUTPACE WAGES IN DENVER CREATING A HOUSING CRISIS FOR MANY WORKING ADULTS. 40% SPEND MORE THAN ONE-THIRD OF THEIR INCOME ON RENT, LEAVING FEWER RESOURCES AVAILABLE FOR THINGS SUCH AS FOOD AND HEALTH CARE. OLDER ADULTS ON FIXED INCOMES ARE DISPROPORTIONATELY AFFECTED BY RISING RENTS. AGING IN PLACE IS A GOAL FOR OLDER ADULTS, BUT IS BECOMING INCREASINGLY CHALLENGING IN DOWNTOWN DENVER DUE TO A LACK OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING. SAINT JOSEPH HOSPITAL LEVERAGED THE OPPORTUNITY TO WORK WITH HOUSING DEVELOPER, MGL PARTNERS/SOLVERA ADVISORS TO CONVERT A 1930'S FORMER NURSING DORMITORY INTO AFFORDABLE HOUSING FOR SENIORS. TAMMEN HALL, THE 52,000-SQARE-FOOT BUILDING, HAS 49 ONE AND TWO-BEDROOM APARTMENTS FOR PEOPLE WHO ARE AT LEAST 62 AND ARE QUALIFIED BASED ON INCOME. THE BUILDING, LOCATED ON THE HOSPITAL CAMPUS, OPENED IN OCTOBER OF 2019. IN 2020, HEALTH PROGRAMMING OFFERED BY SJH FOR THE RESIDENTS OF TAMMEN HALL BEGAN IN ERNEST. A WEEKLY YOGA CLASS, NUTRITION EDUCATION, AND A WALKING GROUP ALL SAW EXCELLENT ATTENDANCE UNTIL THE PROGRAMS WERE CURTAILED DUE TO THE COVID PANDEMIC.

FOOD INSECURITY

SOCIETY HAS LONG ACKNOWLEDGED THE DIRECT HEALTH IMPACT OF HOW AND WHAT WE EAT. FOR SOME DENVER COMMUNITIES ACCESS TO HEALTHY AND AFFORDABLE FOOD OPTIONS POSE A MAJOR CHALLENGE TO IMPROVING THEIR HEALTH. APPROXIMATELY 27,000 DENVER RESIDENTS HAVE LOW INCOME AND LOW ACCESS TO A FULL SERVICE GROCERY STORE, MAKING THE PURCHASE OF HEALTHY FOODS DIFFICULT. 14% OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS WENT HUNGRY SOMETIMES OR ALL THE TIME IN THE PAST 30 DAYS AS A RESULT OF A LACK OF FOOD AT HOME. ROUGHLY 134,390 DENVER HOUSEHOLDS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR THE SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SNAP) BUT ONLY 62% OF ELIGIBLE HOUSEHOLDS ARE ENROLLED AND FIVE OF THE NINE NEIGHBORHOODS IN THE SJH SERVICE AREA ARE FOOD DESERTS. WITH THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE COVID PANDEMIC, MOST PROMINENTLY LOSS OF EMPLOYMENT, COMMUNITY NEEDS INVOLVING FOOD AND FOOD ACCESS INCREASED STEADILY THROUGHOUT 2020.

WITH THESE CONDITIONS IN MIND, SEVERAL EFFORTS FROM PREVIOUS YEARS CONTINUED IN 2020 AND SJH RESOURCED A FLASH FREEZER SO THAT A LOCAL SCHOOL COULD PROVIDE PREPARED MEALS TO COMMUNITY MEMBERS IN NEED.

1. IN PARTNERSHIP WITH METRO CARING (A NEIGHBORHOOD FOOD BANK), SJH DEVELOPED AN INTERVENTION IN 2016 TO MEET THE HUNGER NEEDS OF PATIENTS THROUGH THE SJH SAFETY NET CLINICS. THROUGH FOOD INSECURITY SCREENING IN THESE CLINICS MORE THAN 18,000 PEOPLE WERE SCREENED AND MORE THAN 3900 WERE IDENTIFIED AS FOOD INSECURE AND RECEIVED RESOURCES TO HELP IN 2020. THOSE WITH THE MOST CRITICAL NEED FOR FOOD WERE REFERRED TO METRO CARING TO RECEIVE A TWO-WEEK SUPPLY OF FRESH FOOD.

COMMUNITY GARDENING CONTINUED IN 2020 ON THE .75 ACRE PLOT ON THE SJH CAMPUS. 30 COMMUNITY RESIDENTS CARED FOR TWENTY-SIX GARDEN BEDS GROWING A SURPLUS OF FRESH FOOD THAT WAS SHARED WITH OTHER RESIDENTS AND IN THE METRO CARING FOOD BANK MARKET. IN SEPTEMBER, SJH WAS A SPONSOR OF A HARVEST SHARE EVENT WHICH ALLOWED RESIDENTS AN OPPORTUNITY TO GET OUTSIDE AT SIX LOCAL PARKS AND RECEIVE A BOUNTY OF HOMEGROWN, FRESH PRODUCE. 600 RESIDENTS TOOK PART IN THE EVENT.

3. AS THE COMMUNITY NEED FOR HEALTHY FOOD INCREASED IN 2020, SJH PARTNERED WITH BRUCE RANDOLF K-8 SCHOOL TO PROVIDE A FLASH FREEZER. THE FREEZER MAKES IT POSSIBLE FOR THE NUTRITION STAFF AT BRUCE RANDOLF SCHOOL TO MAKE AND FREEZE 125 EXTRA MEALS PER WEEK FOR DISTRIBUTION TO NEARBY RESIDENTS. THIS EFFORT REDUCES FOOD WASTE AND BRINGS NUTRITIOUS, PREPARED FOOD TO THE LOCAL COMMUNITY.

4. SURPLUS FOODS FROZEN FROM THE SJH CAF IN 2020 RESULTED IN 2200 LBS OF PREPARED FOOD BEING DONATED TO SENIOR SUPPORT SERVICES, A LOCAL ORGANIZATION SERVING INDIVIDUALS AGES 55 AND OVER, WHO ARE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS. THIS PROGRAM IN PARTNERSHIP WITH SODEXO FOOD SERVICE, IMPACTS FOOD ACCESS AND THE ENVIRONMENT.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ACCESS

THOSE WHO SUFFER FROM SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS ARE TWICE AS LIKELY TO SUFFER FROM MENTAL ILLNESS LIKE MOOD AND ANXIETY DISORDERS. MORE THAN 1/3 OF DENVER ADULTS REPORT AT LEAST ONE POOR MENTAL HEALTH DAY IN THE PAST MONTH. 2020 WAS A CHALLENGING YEAR TO DELIVER CRITICAL SERVICES AND

1. PREGNANCY AND CHILDBIRTH ARE EXPERIENCES THAT OFTEN AFFECT THE WAY WOMEN THINK, FEEL, AND VIEW THE WORLD. WHILE OUR SOCIETY DOESN'T ALWAYS RECOGNIZE THIS, MOST WOMEN INTUITIVELY KNOW THAT THIS JOURNEY WILL IMPACT EVERY ASPECT OF LIFE. THIS OFTEN BECOMES OVERWHELMING FOR MANY WOMEN. BECAUSE OF THE MANY ADJUSTMENTS THAT ARE REQUIRED DURING THIS TRANSITION, IT'S NOT SURPRISING THAT PERINATAL MOOD AND ANXIETY DISORDERS ARE THE SINGLE LARGEST COMPLICATION OF PREGNANCY AND CHILDBIRTH, AFFECTING 1 IN 7 WOMEN (15%).

SCREENED FOR PERINATAL MOOD AND ANXIETY DISORDERS (PMAD). THE TOTAL NUMBER SCREENED WAS 4,009 WITH AN AVERAGE POSITIVITY RATING OF 9%. TO TREAT THOSE TESTING POSITIVE, A PROGRAM CALLED "BLOOM" WAS INITIATED IN 2020. THE BLOOM TEAM CONSISTS OF LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKERS, LICENSED PROFESSIONAL COUNSELORS, A REGISTERED DIETITIAN AND A BI-LINGUAL CASE MANAGER. THE TEAM HAS VARIED EXPERIENCE IN PERINATAL MENTAL HEALTH, INFANT MENTAL HEALTH, NICU, BIRTH TRAUMA, PERINATAL PALLIATIVE CARE AND PERINATAL BEREAVEMENT. THIS TEAM OFFERS A COMPREHENSIVE LIST OF SERVICES INCLUDING THERAPY GROUPS, ONE-ON-ONE COUNSELING, AND WRAP AROUND SERVICES. THE BLOOM PROGRAM ENGAGED 146 FAMILIES IN SERVICES IN 2020.

2. THROUGH A PARTNERSHIP WITH ROCKY MOUNTAIN CRISIS PARTNERS, SJH'S EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT IS IN ITS FIFTH YEAR PARTICIPATING IN A FOLLOW UP PROGRAM FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE ATTEMPTED SUICIDE. WHEN A PATIENT PRESENTS IN THE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT OR AN INPATIENT UNIT WITH A SUICIDE RISK OR ATTEMPT, THEY ARE OFFERED A "WARM" REFERRAL FOR FOLLOW UP TO THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN CRISIS PARTNERS. RESEARCH SHOWS THAT SUPPORT OFFERED DURING THIS CRITICAL PERIOD CAN LEAD TO STABILIZED MENTAL HEALTH, INCREASED LIKELIHOOD OF FOLLOW UP CARE, AND A REDUCTION IN FUTURE SUICIDE ATTEMPTS. IN 2020, 141 PATIENTS WERE REFERRED FOR FOLLOW UP CARE. NONE OF THOSE REFERRED RETURNED TO THE SJH EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT WITH A MENTAL HEALTH CONCERN AND ZERO ATTEMPTED SUICIDE.

3. THE COVID PANDEMIC CREATED MENTAL HEALTH CHALLENGES WITHIN OUR LOCAL COMMUNITY RELATED TO ISOLATION AND CHANGES IN ALMOST EVERY ASPECT OF DAILY LIFE. SJH PARTNERED WITH THE ROBERT A. MILLER EDUCATIONAL

RESOURCE CENTER TO SUPPORT THEIR PROGRAM, PROJECT H.O.M.E. (HEALTHIER OUTCOMES MEANINGFUL ENVIRONMENT). THIS WEEKLY EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM HELPS RESIDENTS DEAL WITH ANXIETY, TRAUMA, AND CHANGE THROUGH A SERIES OF EXERCISES AND GROUP SHARING.

THE NATIONAL COUNCIL ON AGING'S - AGING MASTERY PROGRAM (AMP) WAS OFFERED TO OLDER ADULT COMMUNITY MEMBERS IN 2020, VIRTUALLY. THIS EVIDENCE-BASED PROGRAM ENCOURAGES INDIVIDUALS TO CREATE THEIR OWN PLAYBOOK FOR AGING WELL OVER THE COURSE OF 10-CLASSES. IN THE PROGRAM INDIVIDUALS SET GOALS FOR POSITIVE ACTIONS IN MANY ASPECTS OF THEIR LIVES SUCH AS EXERCISE, NUTRITION, FINANCES, ADVANCE CARE PLANNING, COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT, AND HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS. SUPPORTING OVERALL MENTAL HEALTH IS AN INTENDED BENEFIT OF THIS PROGRAM. AN AMP FOR CAREGIVERS PROGRAM IS ALSO AVAILABLE. SJH OFFERED CLASS ACCESS FOR COMMUNITY MEMBERS AT NO COST EITHER USING A VIRTUAL PLATFORM, IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE DENVER PUBLIC LIBRARY, BOOMERS LEADING CHANGE AND SENIOR PLANET.
